Continue as discussed in Story 21.

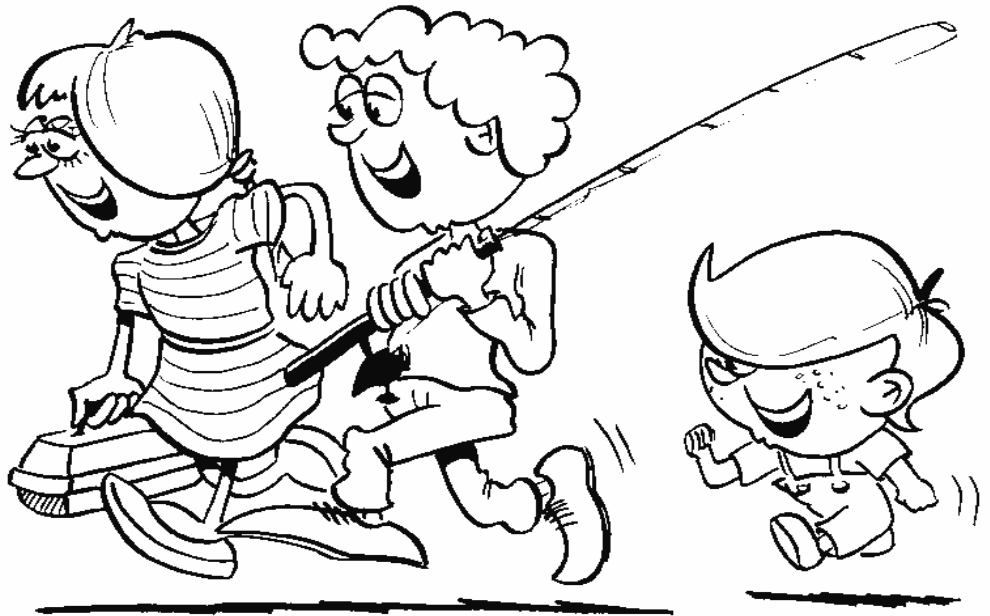
### Phonic Decoding

Try These New Words

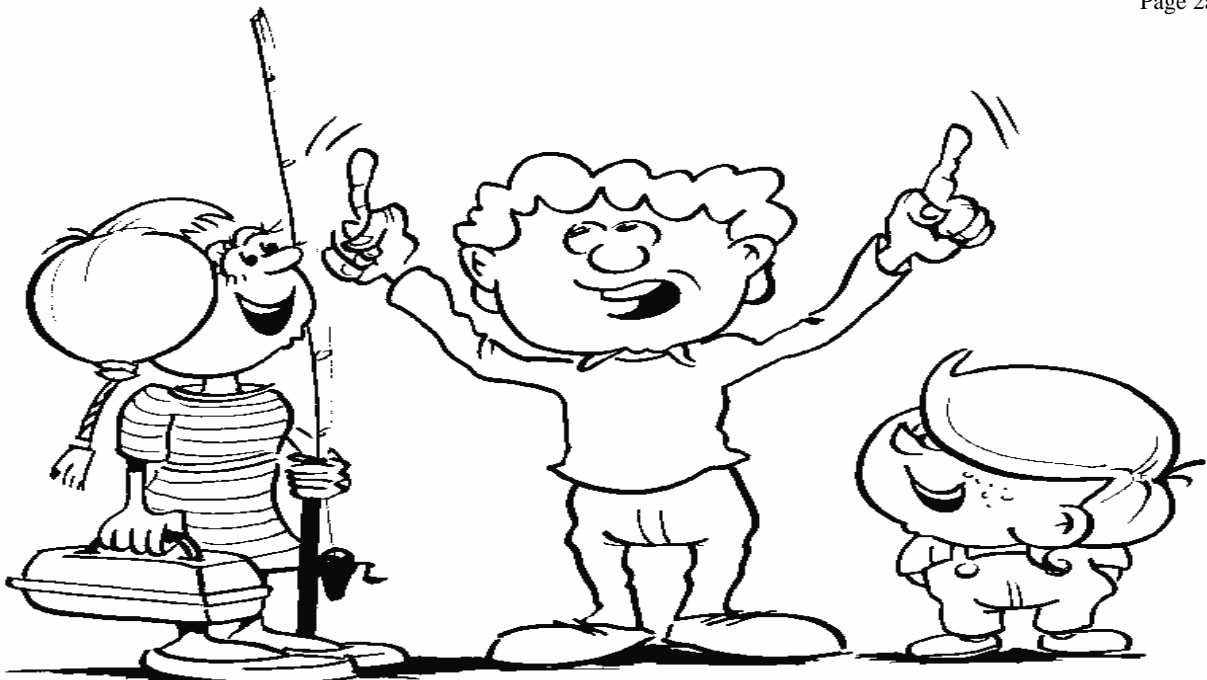
hook look cook shook

threw walked



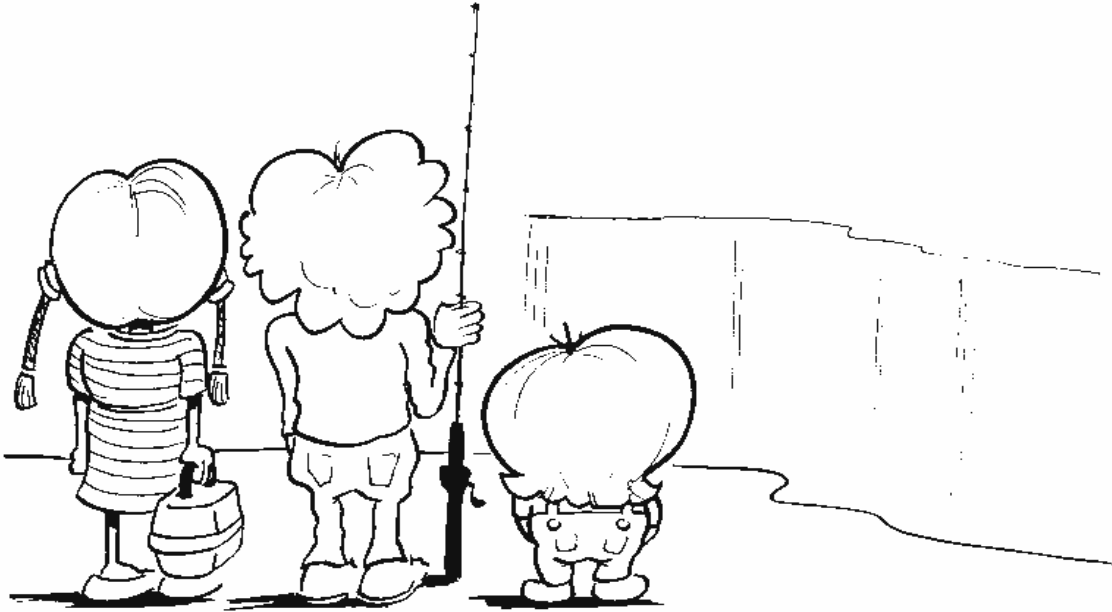
We took a hook down

we can cook.



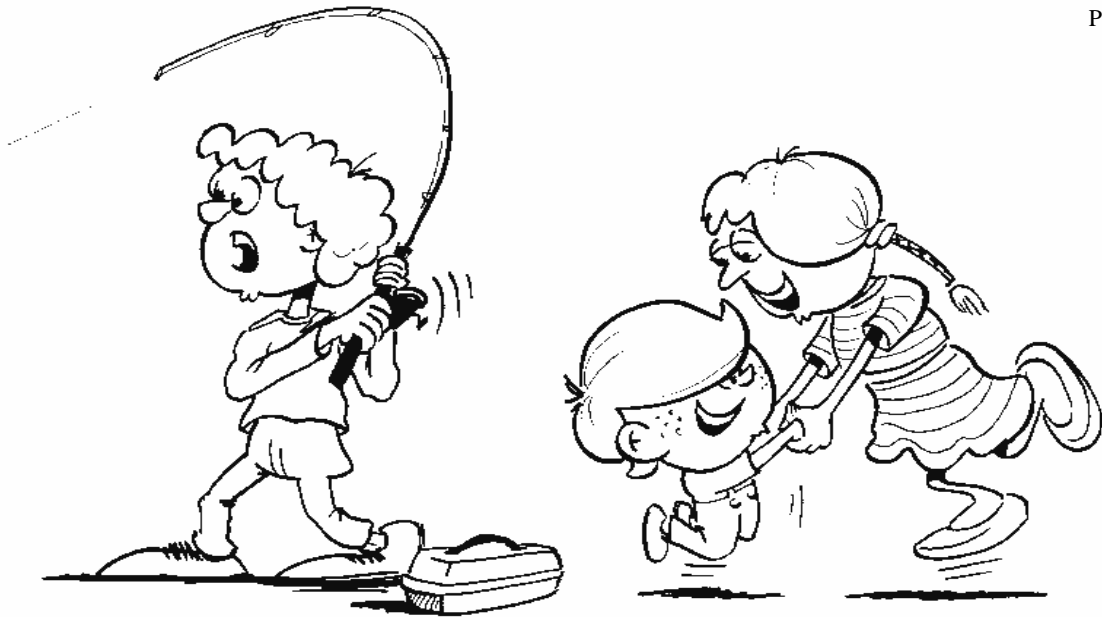
We got to the brook

back for Dad to cook.

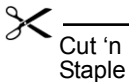
