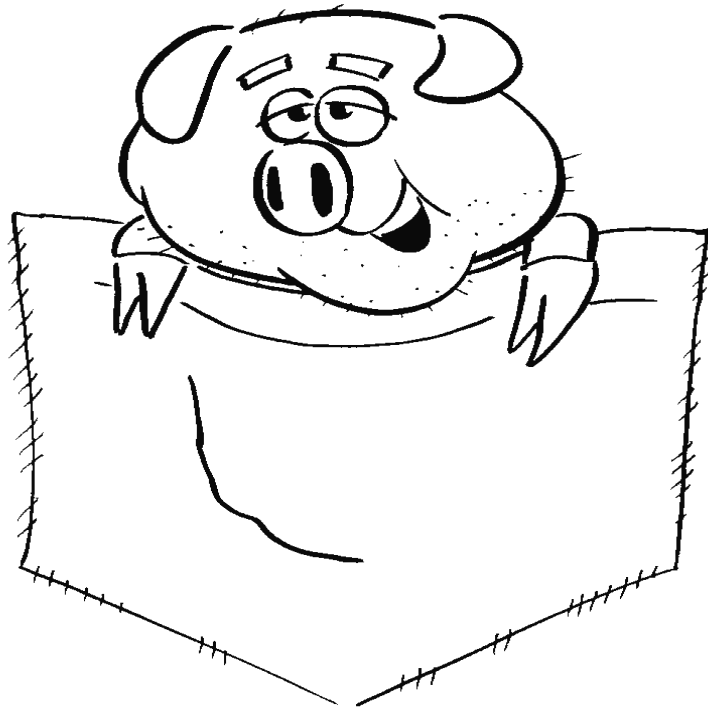
Phonic Decoding

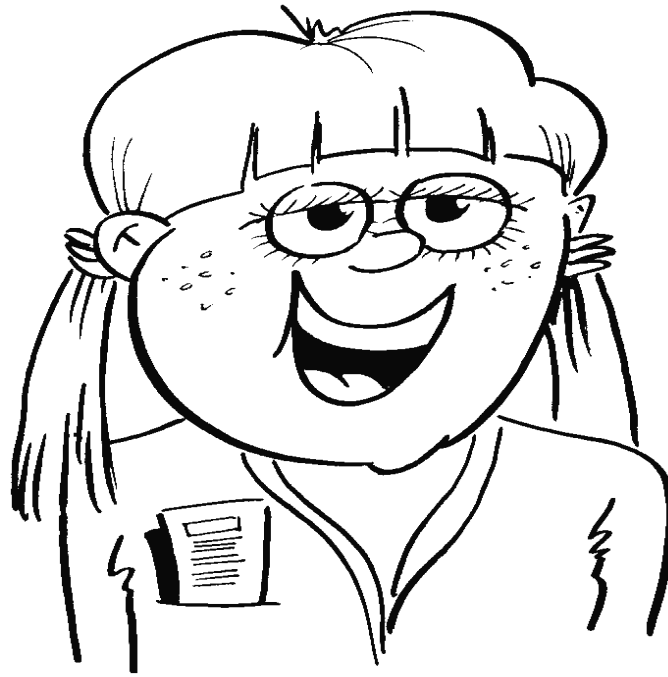


I had a piglet in my pocket.

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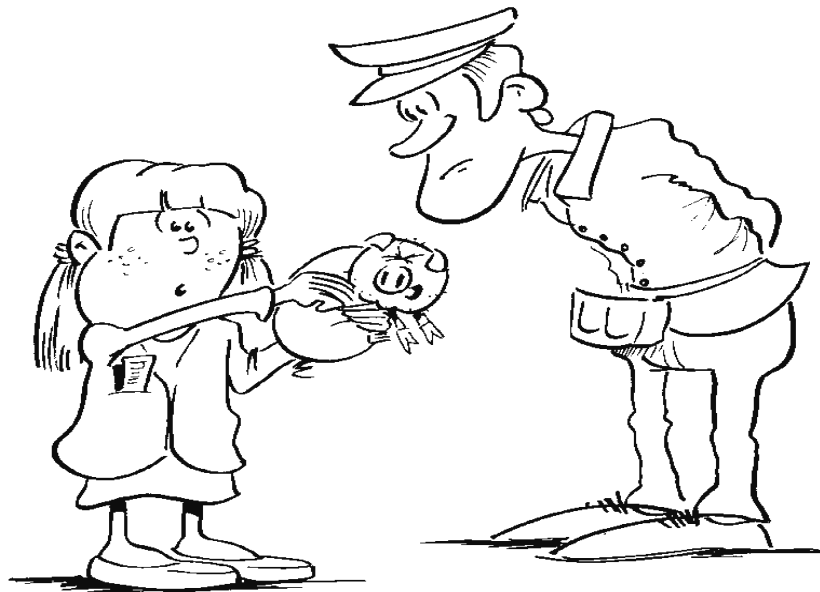
The pocket was in my jacket.



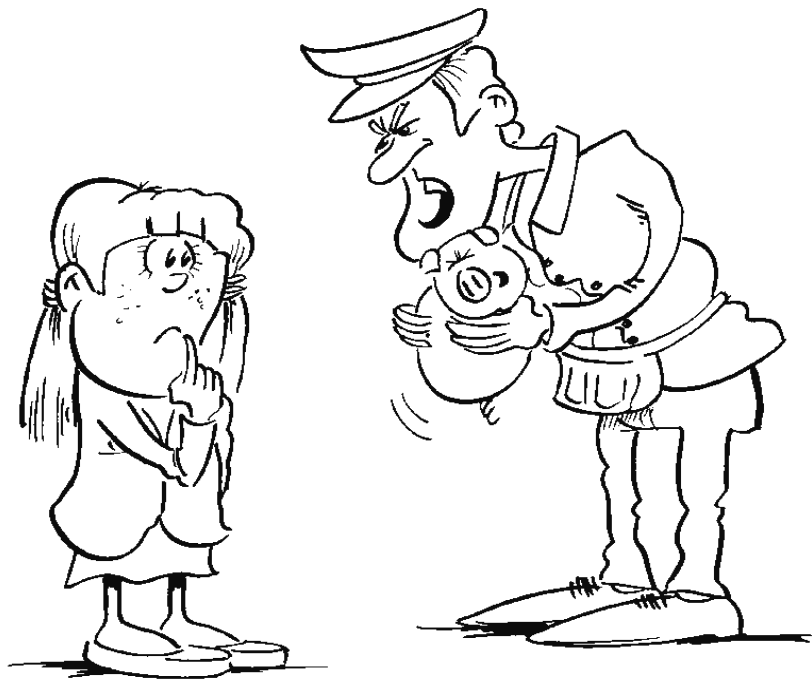
I had a ticket in my pocket.

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And the packet back in my jacket.

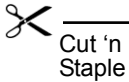
