



Ishtar Gate

Ishtar Gate was built by King Nebuchadnezzar, the Babylonian king. It was the main entrance to the city of Babylon. It was named after the goddess Ishtar. At first the Ishtar Gate was one of the Seven Wonders of the World, but it was replaced by the Lighthouse of Alexandria. 




Babylonian Timeline: Unit 1-5




Babylonian Calendar


