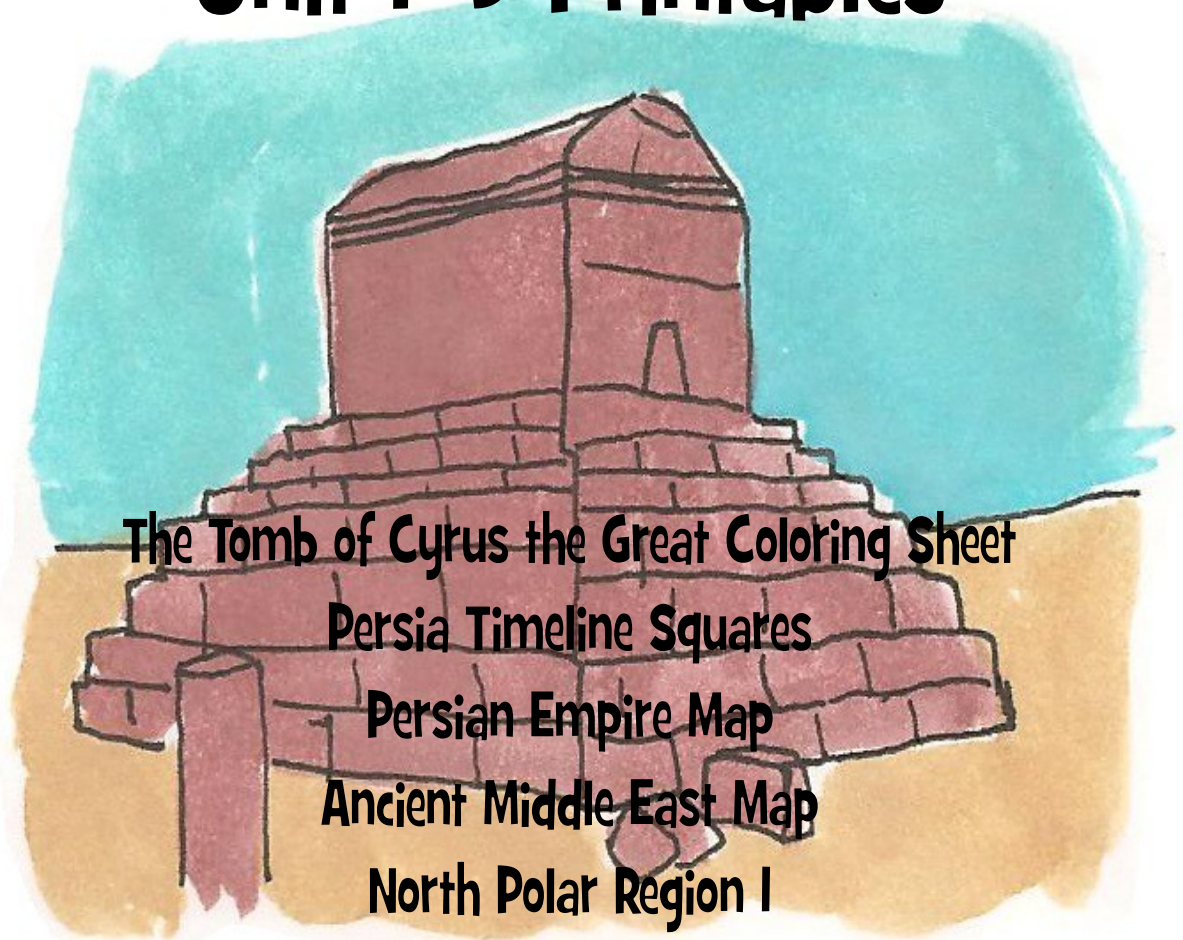

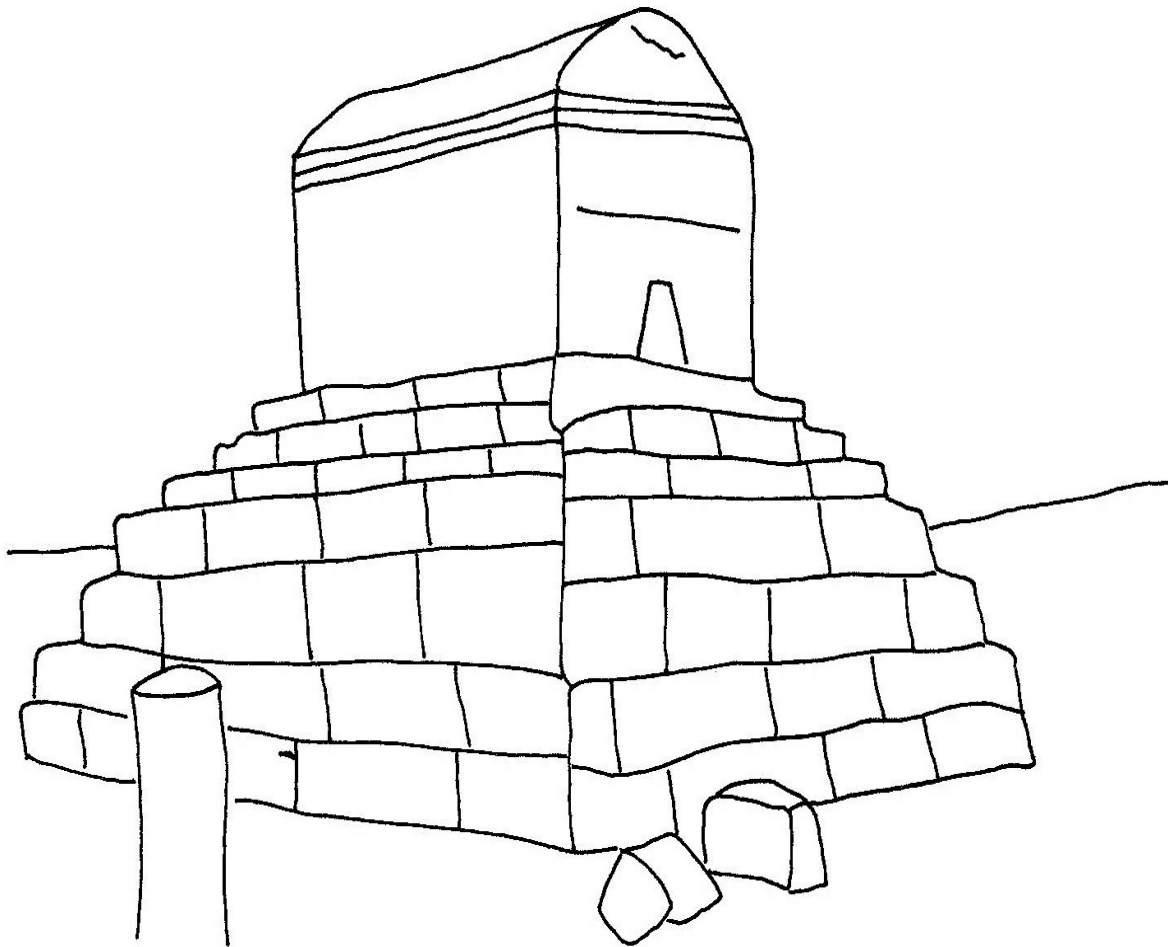

The Tomb of Cyrus The Great

Cyrus the Great was the founder of the Persian Empire. By conquering other nations, but allowing them to keep their own cultures while paying him tribute, he expanded his wealth and territory very quickly. He also freed slaves in all the lands he captured. He was buried in a tomb. Inside there was a golden bed, a table set up with drinking cups, a gold coffin, and some ornaments with precious stones. When the Islamic people conquered the region they wanted to destroy the tomb. The people convinced them that it was not the tomb of Cyrus, but was where Solomon's mother was buried. The inscription was changed and it is still known as the tomb of the mother of Solomon.
